NOTES ON A GREEN THEME

Have you heard of Greene Kings Tub2Pub recycling campaign? All those tubs that, up until a very short time ago, were full of chocolates, biscuits and crackers can be taken to The Barmy Arms, The George and/or the St Margaret's Tavern in support of Greene Kings recycling campaign to raise money for Macmillan Cancer Support.

Tub2Pub 2024 saw the pub chain collect over 150,000 tubs raising an incredible £12,600 for the cancer charity. Greene King are hoping to beat last year's record with our help.

You can take your clean and empty tubs to any of the aforementioned pubs at any time until February 16.

Tens of millions of these plastic tubs are purchased every year. It's really good to know that they can be recycled. They will be collected and taken to a plastic reprocessing centre where they are shredded, before being sold onto plastic manufacturers to use in place of virgin plastics.

Our very own recycling basket is still operational at the back of the church. Look out for the wicker basket into which you can put your old batteries, pens, ink

cartridges and spectacles and these will be taken to recycling centres for you when the basket is nearly full.



On 9 February Saraband presents a unique evening exploring the music and stories surrounding our illustrious 18th Century residents, from Alexander Pope to Horace Walpole with the women - royal mistress Henrietta Howard and the actresses Kitty Clive and Peg Woffington who brought talent and gossip to our beautiful riverside Twickenham. Come and enjoy the music they enjoyed in the church they knew, where many of them are buried.

Saraband is a quartet of two baroque violins, including local resident Henrietta Wayne, a baroque cello, theorbo and baroque guitar, the ideal combination for domestic house music. Saraband will play popular tunes of the day linked to our colourful actresses. The repertoire will include music by 18th Century giants Handel, Telemann and Corelli as well as tunes from the biggest box office hit of the time, conceived in Pope's villa in Twickenham, The Beggars' Opera.

GREEN SCHOOL TRUST LOOKING FOR A FINANCE GOVERNOR

The Green School Trust which operates two Church of England secondary schools and a joint sixth form in Isleworth, Hounslow is currently seeking a new director with experience reviewing company budgets and accounts to play a key role on its Finance Committee. All volunteers on its governing bodies are asked to actively support the Christian ethos and distinctiveness of its schools. The Trust's vision is that the Christian character and foundation of its schools will expand the hearts and minds of all its students and staff with kindness and humility.

The trust board is responsible for the Trust's financial performance and this role requires the following time commitment during school term time:

- Attending six board meetings plus six finance committee meetings each academic year (most meetings are held at the school on a Wednesday evening between 6-8pm)
- Reviewing paperwork before each meeting including CEO reports, budgets, management accounts, draft policies, proposed business cases and other items
- Completing induction training on appointment and annual training when required (current mandatory courses include safeguarding and cyber security).

The role is unpaid but they promise:

- Meaningful engagement with current issues facing schools, including staff retention,
 student wellbeing, health and safety and financial sustainability
- Personal satisfaction from supporting the work of the executive team and staff so that they can fulfil their important role as providers of education to the next generation
- Supportive interactions while working as a part of a committed team, reaching important decisions for the benefit of the whole school community
- Continuous learning opportunities through free training provided virtually and face to face.
