NOTES ON A GREEN THEME

An article in last Thursday's Times written by Andrew Ellson, the Consumer Affairs Correspondent caught my eye with the headline: "Halloween causes more plastic waste in the UK than any other event."

He went on to say that the growing popularity of Halloween in the UK is causing a huge volume of plastic waste, with research suggesting that it is now the biggest single use event of the year. (Which considering how much waste there is at Christmas is saying something!) Spending on Halloween has quadrupled over the past decade to an estimated £1 billion a year as communities adopt an American style approach to the day.

Entire streets are often seen to be decorated with giant spiders, cobwebs and plastic skeletons with thousands of children, adults and even dogs dressing up to go trick-ortreating. A recent study found that more than three quarters of Britons who buy Halloween

decorations, masks and other themed items admit to throwing them away after a single use. This could add up to 46 million themed items could be binned every year – equivalent to 3.2 items per child. These items are thrown away because they are seen to be cheap and flimsy and not worth keeping.

It's a harrowing thought isn't it?

Check out the results of this year's Big Plastic Count that was run by Green Peace back in March by going onto the Green Peace site. Do you know where the plastic goes that you put into your recycling? And is there anything else you, your community, the shops in your neighbourhood, your council, the government can be doing?
